# Becoming a Fair Trade School

Most of you will have heard about Fair Trade but some of you won't have. Fair Trade means an equitable and fair partnership between consumers in developed countries like our own and producers in third world/developing countries like Africa.

The chief concern of the Fair Trade movement has been to ensure that the vast majority of the world's farmers (who are small holders) get a fair price for their harvests in order to achieve a decent living wage. Fair Trade works with marginalized producers and workers in order to help them move from a position of vulnerability to security and self-sufficiency.

Here are some of the benefits of Fair Trade for the farmers:

- A regular income
- Workers' pay and conditions improved
- New water supply in the community
- New housing
- Increased efficiency
- Improved health and sanitation
- A cleaner environment
- Improved sport and education in the community

Look out for the mark:



The **FAIRTRADE** Mark is an independent consumer label which appears on products as an independent guarantee that disadvantaged producers in the developing world are getting a better deal. The more people that buy these products, the cheaper they will become for us, yet still benefiting the producers.

You will find the mark on the following products as well as many others:
